The individual will also have familiarity with a variety of pedagogical methods such as online education, module courses and distance deliveries using current technology. The successful candidate will have extensive pastoral experience, and demonstrable engagement in the life and ministry of the church. The position could be part-time or full-time, and rank open. Rank and salary will be determined by qualifications and experience. The candidate will also contribute research and scholarship, service to the school, service to their profession, religious communities, and other contexts.
