MASTER OF ARTS: COUNSELLING AND COUNSELLING PSYCHOLOGY

1. The student will have acquired and articulated a foundational biblical and theological framework from which to thoughtfully and responsibly integrate the Christian faith into life, work, and ministry.
2. The student will have learned and demonstrated the requisite theoretical knowledge and practical skills required to enter the field of professional counselling therapy as an ethical and competent clinician in a variety of contexts.
3. The student will have grown and engaged openly in the process of Christian character development, with the particular aim of becoming an effective helper, as indicated by the consistent demonstration of emotional maturity, relational health, spiritual formation, interpersonal skill development and academic/intellectual rigor within the context of interdisciplinary study.

MASTER OF ARTS: GLOBAL STUDIES

1. The student will become cross-cultural practitioners who integrate missiological theory with missionary practice.
2. The student will become cross-cultural practitioners who discern the cultural dynamics of ministry and take them into account in their own work.
3. The student will become cross-cultural practitioners who communicate a commitment to the missionary task of the church and participate in and advocate for such ministry in all areas of church life.

MASTER OF ARTS: THEOLOGICAL STUDIES

1. The student will have acquired a robust knowledge of Scripture, theology, and current contributors and developments within the student's discipline to ground further study.
2. The student will demonstrate a pattern of excellence in critical research, academic writing, and engagement with scholarship within the student's discipline.
3. The student will have acquired a framework of faith within which to engage in further study, support personal faith formation and to participate in the church's mission.

MASTER OF DIVINITY

1. The student will integrate a biblically based theology with a philosophy of pastoral ministry.
2. The student will formulate a rule of life for personal and ministerial wholeness.
3. The student will exegete the world around them in order to work in a diversity of church models and contexts.
4. The student will articulate Christian truth through exegetically and theologically grounded preaching, teaching, and/or other methods appropriate to the context of their ministry or vocation.
5. The student will formulate methods of catechesis, disciplining or formation appropriate to their ministry context.
6. The student will demonstrate the skills required of a pastor or other ministry professional, such as administration, counselling and spiritual care, and liturgical functions.

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

1. The student will have enhanced vocational capacity for ministry by engaging in practices that are steeped in biblical and theological reflection.
2. The student will build on past vocational training through advanced research and learning to clarify and resolve complex issues of the local ministry context.
3. The student will develop inner-life vocational practices (both compensated and volunteer ministry practitioners) to serve as people of Christ-like integrity.
