HON. KELVIN GOERTZEN, MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND ATTORNEY GENERAL

Graduation Speaker

Kelvin Goertzen has had the honour of serving as the MLA for the Steinbach constituency since 2003. He is currently the province's Minister of Justice, Attorney General and Government House Leader. He also serves as the co-chair of the Midwest Canada-U.S. Relations Committee.

Since being elected to government, Kelvin has served in several senior roles. He has previously served as the Minister of Health, Seniors and Active Living, the Minister of Education and Training, the Minister of Legislative and Public Affairs and has been the Minister responsible for Immigration.

Kelvin also served as the 23rd Premier of Manitoba in the fall of 2021 following the resignation of Brian Pallister. He is the first person from southeast Manitoba to serve as Premier. During that time, he also served as the Interim Leader of the Manitoba Progressive Conservative Party.

A graduate of the University of Manitoba, Kelvin has degrees in economics, commerce, and law. Kelvin began his time in the Manitoba Legislature as an intern in 1996 and is the first Manitoba legislative intern to have ultimately served in a provincial Cabinet and become Premier.

Kelvin is married to Kim, and together they have a son named Malachi.



TÉA WIEBE, BA University College Valedictorian

Téa Wiebe began her schooling at Providence in 2019, coming from the city of Morden, Manitoba. With an eagerness to know and understand the truth, she came to Providence to study Philosophy and Psychology. To her disappointment, the Philosophy professor had recently resigned which led her to dip her toes into Sociology. The discipline quickly became one of her majors and she spent the following three years completing a Social Science degree.

During her time at Providence, she took on various student roles including Resident Assistant (RA), Worship Leader, Senior Resident Assistant (SRA), Summer Maintenance Team Worker, and Women's Basketball Assistant Coach. Though these positions were extremely out of her comfort zone, she experienced a community at Providence that could see both her strengths and weaknesses and encouraged her to freely share them with others.

As she puts this chapter of her life to a close, Téa looks forward to pursuing the art of living well and using her voice to create space for healing.



PAUL BLAIR BSc, MDiv, DMin Theological Seminary Valedictorian

Paul Blair had initially intended to pursue a career in the natural sciences, obtaining a Bachelor degree with double honours in Physics and Mathematics from the University of Manitoba, but the unbidden awakening of a vocation to ministry towards the end of his baccalaureate program led him to seek out Theological Studies instead.

In 2016, he completed a Master of Divinity degree at Sacred Heart School of Theology in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, as well as a Master of Arts degree with a concentration in Systematic Theology. He then returned to his hometown of Winnipeg, Manitoba to serve as a Healthcare Chaplain at Riverview Health Centre, and to begin a family with his wife, Clare. In 2019, he enrolled in the Doctor of Ministry program at Providence Theological Seminary and has recently completed his dissertation on the ministry of exorcism. He plans to continue his present work supporting the spiritual needs of patients and their families but is also looking forward to opportunities to teach.

He is grateful for his time at Providence, and is especially thankful to Dr. Tim Perry and Dr. Jeff Anderson for their guidance and encouragement throughout his studies.

SUNDAY OLUKOJU BA, MDiv, PhD

Joint Theological Seminary Alumnus of the Year

Sunday Olukoju is an Ordained Minister under the Evangelical Missionary Church of Canada (EMCC). He and his wife, Deborah, preside as Senior Pastors of Immanuel Fellowship Church. Sunday came to know about Providence through his wife who was enrolled in the Master of Divinity program at the time (1999). Both are blessed with two sons.

In addition to his work in the local church, Sunday worked as an International Student Officer at Providence, Research Assistant at the University of Winnipeg, Assistant Professor at Trident University International, Counselor at the Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology, Director of Distant Education at Providence Theological Seminary, Instructor at Athabasca University, Director of Academics at LINKS Institute, and currently serves as the Manitoba Hub Coordinator of the PHAC-sponsored ABR research project within the African, Caribbean and Black (ACB) population.

Sunday has two Master of Arts degrees – one in International Law and Diplomacy from the University of Lagos and the other in Educational Studies from Providence Theological Seminary. He has also earned two doctoral degrees – the first in Public Policy and Administration from Walden University; and the second in Theology from Matej Bel University.



DEBORAH OLUKOJU BTh, MA, DMin Joint Theological Seminary Alumna of the Year

Deborah Olukoju is an Ordained Minister under the Evangelical Missionary Church of Canada (EMCC), a Chaplain, Community Leader, and Senior Pastor of Immanuel Fellowship Church. She came to Providence for her Master of Arts degree after graduating with a Bachelor of Theology from Emmanuel Bible College in Kitchener, Ontario.

In addition to leading a local congregation, Deborah served as the Community Liaison Person with the Government of Manitoba to facilitate the migration of thousands of Nigerians to Winnipeg under the Provincial Nominee Program from 2005 to 2008.

Under her roof, she housed, fed, counseled, and guided hundreds of new immigrants who are flourishing in Manitoba today. She has worked as a Chaplain at the Health Sciences Centre, Concordia Hospital, and currently at Manitoba Justice. She taught *Spiritual Formation* for Providence through the Riverview Health Centre.

Deborah is the first woman to earn a Doctor of Ministry degree from Providence and the first woman ordained by her denomination. She has received the Prime Minister's Volunteer Award in recognition of her community service, as well as the YMCA/YWCA 'Women of Distinction Award' in leadership and volunteerism.



TERRY JANKE BA, MDiv, DMin University College Alumnus of the Year

Terry Janke grew up in Hanover, ON and came to Providence (then known as Winnipeg Bible College) in January 1979. He played on the hockey team and was involved in the Student Council, becoming the Student Body President during his last year. He met his wife, Pat, at Providence and they have served together in ministry for more than 40 years.

After graduating with a BA in Biblical Studies, Terry pastored at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Eagle River, ON. Then, he completed his Master of Divinity at Acadia Divinity College before being called to shepherd the First Baptist Church in Thunder Bay, ON.

In 2002, they moved to Bolivia to serve with Canadian Baptist Ministries where he and Pat taught *Spiritual Formation* at the Seminary in Cochabamba. While there, Terry completed a Doctor of Ministry degree before returning to Canada and being appointed as Lead Pastor of Whyte Ridge Baptist Church in 2009. They continue to have a love for Latin American people and culture, having returned to Bolivia with several ministry teams over the last decade.

Terry and Pat have three children and three grandchildren. They love spending time with family, travelling, being in the outdoors and engaging in global discipleship for Jesus.
