36 Credits; 3 Parts

Part 1: Certificate in Care-Focused Language Teaching (15 credits)

- Teaching Grammar, Vocabulary and Pronunciation in Context
- Language and Psychological Trauma
- Ways and Resources in Teaching and Learning
- Observing and Teaching Practicum with an Arts-based Curriculum

Part 2: Certificate in Care-Focused Education (15 credits)

- Cross-Cultural Communication
- Conflict, Crisis, Hospitality and Peacebuilding
- Psychological Trauma and Resilience in Educational Settings
- Arts for Learning and Healing 1: Caring for the Learners
- Arts for Learning and Healing 2: Caring for the Caregiver

Part 3: Capstone Research Project (6 credits)

- Thesis/Project that integrates insights and skills gained in parts 1 & 2 of the program
